

Summary of Preschool Bus Procedures for students on IEP's Cache-Logan District Transportation

The driver(s) will give you a 15-20 minute window of time when they will be at your house. Your child must be ready when the bus gets there. The driver will only wait 3 minutes before leaving.

Service is curb-to-curb. Students will be picked up at the curb or a point assigned by the Transportation Supervisor. Drivers are to avoid situations that would require backing-up of the bus.

If your child is not going to be coming to school, please contact the driver on their cell phone or bus dispatch between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm.

If your child is not going to school and you do not notify busing and the bus comes to your house 3 days in a row, transportation will be stopped until the situation can be worked out. The driver will notify you when busing will start again.

Students will be delivered only to their assigned stops. If you need to make a one-time change, you need to contact the bus/Riverside three days before.

Preschool students will be placed in seat belts. Car seats are available if needed.

Parents are responsible for making sure wheelchairs or other equipment are in good and safe condition.

When the bus arrives after school, the person receiving the child must meet the bus immediately. If no one is there, the bus driver will attempt to make contact by phone. If that is not successful, the driver will check with the bus supervisor for emergency contact information. It is the responsibility of the parent to meet up with the bus later in the route. The bus will not come back to the house to drop off the child. If no other options are available and the child is still on the bus at the end of the route, the Transportation Supervisor will call Logan City Police Dispatch to report an unaccompanied child. Logan City Police Dispatch will then determine the next course of action. Parents will have to show photo ID to police to receive the child.
